Instruction at the Camp is provided by faculty and staff of the Department of Dairy and Animal Science and the Department of Veterinary and Biological Sciences at Penn State University.

The cost of the Camp is \$225 per camper and includes meals, chaperoned double occupancy lodging for 4 nights in university dorms, and all program materials.

Campers may bring money for souvenirs and spending money.

Campers should be at least 13 years old and no older than 18 years old on January 1, 2008.
