**RULES AND REGULATIONS IN BRIEF**

1. Any boy or girl who is enrolled in a qualified 4-H or FFA dairy project whose entries received a blue ribbon in type at a 2009 district show is eligible. Any exhibitor may exhibit no more than three animals.
  2. Exhibitors are responsible for getting their animals to the appropriate ring on time. **All exhibitors must show their own animals**, except when granted a substitute showman exemption by the show director or assistant. The substitute showman must be a 4-H or FFA the same age or younger than the exhibitor. Adult supervision will be provided at ringside for unruly animals. In any case, the exhibitor must remain with the animal.
  3. Showmanship judges will select Master Showman winners while the type judge is placing the animals.
  4. **A plain all-white uniform is required.** Clothes should be neat and clean. Skirts need to be knee length or longer. No sleeveless shirts, jeans, hats, shorts, sandals, or bare feet are permitted.
  5. All exhibitors are expected to adhere to the PA Junior Dairy Show codes of conduct, PDCA Show Ring Code of Ethics, the PA 4-H Code of Conduct, and/or the FFA Code of Ethics, and they are expected to comply with ultrasounding requests in a timely manner.
